






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
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













































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## **Product description**

The product is a pedestrian-controlled rotary lawn mower. It floats on a cushion of air which makes it easy to cut grass in all areas of the lawn.

#### Intended use

Use the product to cut grass in larger private gardens or public lawns. Can be used on slopes of maximum 45°. Do not use the product for other tasks.

This product is in accordance with (Fig. 9) applicable EC directives.

Noise emission to the environment according to the European Community's Directive. The product's emission is specified in the Technical data chapter and on the label.

- Look out for roots, stones, twigs, pits, ditches and other obstacles. Long grass can prevent a clear view
- To cut grass on slopes can be dangerous. Do not use the product on ground that slopes more than 45°. Do not cut grass on wet slopes.
- When you cut grass on a slope, always keep your feet on level ground and the product below you on the slope.
- Operate the product across the face of slopes. Do not move up and down.
- Be careful when you go near hidden corners and objects that prevent a clear view.

#### Work safety



**WARNING:** Read the warning instructions that follow before you use the product.

- Use this product to cut grass lawns only. It is not permitted to use it for other tasks.
- Use personal protective equipment. See Personal protective equipment on page 8.
- Do not start the engine in a closed space or near flammable material. The exhaust fumes from the engine are hot and can contain sparks which can start a fire.
- Do not operate the product unless the blade and all covers are attached correctly. An incorrectly attached blade can come off and cause injury.

- Make sure that the blade does not hit objects such as stones and roots. This can do damage to the blade and bend the engine shaft. A bent axle causes heavy vibration and a very high risk that the blade becomes loose.
- If the blade hits an object or if vibrations occur, stop the product immediately. Disconnect the ignition cable from the spark plug. Examine the product for damages. Repair damages or let an approved service agent do the repair.
- Do not attach the engine brake handle permanently to the handle when the engine is on.
- Put the product on a stable, flat surface and start it.
  Make sure that the blade does not hit the ground or other objects.
- Always stay behind the product when you operate it.
- Keep 2 hands on the handle when you operate the product. Keep your hands and feet away from the rotating blades.
- Be careful when you pull the product rearward.
- Do not lift up the product when the engine is on. If you must lift the product, first stop the engine and disconnect the spark plug cable from the spark plug.
- · Do not walk rearward when you operate the product.
- Stop the engine when you move across areas without grass, for example paths made of gravel, stone and asphalt.
- Do not run with the product when the engine is on.
  Always walk when you operate the product.
- Do not let the product stay out of view with the engine started. Stop the engine and wait until the cutting equipment stops to rotate.

# Safety instructions for operation

#### Personal protective equipment



**WARNING:** Read the warning instructions that follow before you use the product.

- Personal protective equipment cannot fully prevent injury but it decreases the degree of injury if an accident does occur. Let your dealer help you select the right equipment.
- Use heavy-duty slip-resistant boots or shoes. Do not use open shoes or go with bare feet.
- Use heavy, long pants.
- Use protective gloves when necessary, for example when you attach, examine or clean the cutting equipment.

#### Safety devices on the product



**WARNING:** Read the warning instructions that follow before you use the product.

Do not use a product with defective safety devices.

 Do a check of the safety devices regularly. If the safety devices are defective, speak to your Flymo service agent.

#### **Cutting cover**

 Examine the cutting cover to make sure that there are no damages such as cracks.

#### Engine brake handle

The engine brake handle stops the engine. When the engine brake handle is released, the engine stops.

To do an inspection of the engine brake, start the engine and then release the engine brake handle. If the engine does not stop in 3 seconds, let an approved Flymo service agent adjust the engine brake.

#### Muffler

The muffler keeps the noise levels to a minimum and sends the exhaust fumes away from the operator.

Do not use the product if the muffler is missing or defective. A defective muffler increases the noise level and the risk of fire.

Examine the muffler regularly to make sure that it is attached correctly and not damaged.



**CAUTION:** The muffler becomes very hot during and after use and when the engine operates at idle speed. Be careful near flammable materials and/or fumes to prevent fire.

#### **Fuel safety**



**WARNING:** Read the warning instructions that follow before you use the product.

- Do not start the product if there is fuel or engine oil on the product. Remove the unwanted fuel/oil and let the product dry.
- If you spill fuel on your clothing, change clothing immediately.
- Do not get fuel on your body, it can cause injury. If you get fuel on your body, use soap and water to remove the fuel.
- Do not start the product if the engine has a leak. Examine the engine for leaks regularly.
- Be careful with fuel. Fuel is flammable and the fumes are explosive and can cause injuries or death.
- Do not breathe in the fuel fumes, it can cause injury.
  Make sure that there is a sufficient airflow.
- · Do not smoke near the fuel or the engine.
- Do not put warm objects near the fuel or the engine.
- Do not add the fuel when the engine is on.
- Make sure that the engine is cool before you refuel.

- Before you refuel, open the fuel tank cap slowly and release the pressure carefully.
- Do not add fuel to the engine in an indoor area. Not sufficient airflow can cause injury or death because of asphyxiation or carbon monoxide.
- Tighten the fuel tank cap fully. If the fuel tank cap is not tightened, there is a risk of fire.
- Move the product a minimum of 3 m (10 ft) from the position where you filled the tank before a start.
- · Do not put too much fuel in the fuel tank.

## Safety instructions for maintenance



**WARNING:** Read the warning instructions that follow before you use the product.

 The exhaust fumes from the engine contain carbon monoxide, an odourless, poisonous and very dangerous gas. Do not start the engine indoors or in closed spaces.

- Before you do the maintenance on the product, stop the engine and remove the ignition cable from the spark plug.
- Use protective gloves when you do maintenance on the cutting equipment. The blade is very sharp and cuts can easily occur.
- Accessories and changes to the product that are not approved by the manufacturer, can cause serious injury or death. Do not change the product. Always use accessories that are approved by the manufacturer.
- If the maintenance is not done correctly and regularly, the risk of injury and damage to the product increases.
- Only do the maintenance as given in this owner's manual. All other servicing must be done by an approved Flymo service agent.
- Let an approved Flymo service agent do servicing on the product regularly.
- · Replace damaged, worn or broken parts.

# **Assembly**

#### To assemble the lower handle

- Put the hook attached to the handle (A) through the center slot (B), in the direction of the arrow (C).(Fig. 16)
- Turn the handle clockwise 90° to put the ends of the lower handle between the brackets (D) on the cutting cover
- Put the clevis pins (A) through the brackets and the ends of the lower handle. Lock with the lockpins (B). (Fig. 17)

# To assemble the upper handle

- Put the lower handle in park position, see To set the handle position on page 10.
- Make sure that the choke control is on the left side of the product when viewed from the rear.
- Align the holes in the upper handle with the holes in the lower handle and attach the screws, washers and knobs.(Fig. 18)
- 4. Use the straps to attach the cables to the handle. (Fig. 19)



**CAUTION:** Make sure that the tension in the cables is not too high.

# To assemble the transport wheels (accessory)

- Put the hook attached to the handle (A) through the center slot (B), in the direction of the arrow (C).(Fig. 20)
- Turn the handle clockwise 90° to put the ends of the lower handle between the brackets (D) on the cutting cover.
- 3. Put the bushing (A) through the brackets and the ends of the lower handle.(Fig. 21)
- Attach the wheel frame (A) to the cutting deck with the screws (B), washers (C, D) and locknuts (E).(Fig. 22)
- Put the lower extension tubes into the top extension tubes.
- Put the clevis pins (A) through the extension tubes and lock with the lockpins (B).(Fig. 23)

# Operation

#### Introduction



**WARNING:** Before you operate the product, you must read and understand the safety chapter.

# Before you operate the product

- Read the operator's manual carefully and make sure that you understand the instructions.
- Examine the cutting equipment to make sure that it is correctly attached and adjusted. See *To examine* the cutting equipment on page 11.
- 3. Fill the fuel tank. See To fill fuel on page 10.

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4. Fill the oil tank and do a check of the oil level. See *To fill and change the engine oil on page 12.* 

#### To fill fuel

If available, use low-emission/alkylate gasoline. If lowemission/alkylate gasoline is not available, use good quality unleaded gasoline or leaded gasoline. Use gasoline with octane number not less than 90 (87 AKI) and with a maximum of 10% ethanol (E10).



**CAUTION:** Do not use gasoline with an octane number less than 90 RON (87 AKI). This can cause damage to the product.

- Open the fuel tank cap slowly to release the pressure.
- Fill slowly with a fuel can. If you spill fuel, remove it with a cloth and let remaining fuel dry off.
- 3. Clean the area around the fuel tank cap.
- Tighten the fuel tank cap fully. If the fuel tank cap is not tightened, there is a risk of fire.
- 5. Move the product a minimum of 3 m (10 ft) from the position where you filled the tank, before a start.

#### To set the handle position

- 1. Lift the hook (A).(Fig. 24)
- Push the hook forward to set the handle in park position (B).
- Pull the hook rearward to set the handle in mow position (C).

# To start the product

- Make sure that the ignition cable is connected to the spark plug.
- 2. Set the handle in park position, see *To set the handle position on page 10.*
- 3. Open the fuel valve.(Fig. 25)
- 4. Adjust the choke control.
  - a) If the engine is cold, set the choke control to the choke position. (Fig. 26)
  - b) If the engine is warm, set the choke control to the operation position.(Fig. 27)

- 5. Hold the engine brake handle against the handlebar.
- 6. Put your right foot on the cutting cover.
- Hold the top of the lower handle with your right hand and tilt the product.
- 8. Hold the starter rope handle with your right hand. (Fig. 28)
- Slowly pull out the starter rope until you feel some resistance.
- 10. Pull with force to start the engine.
- 11. When the engine is at full speed, carefully lower the product to the ground.
- 12. When the engine is warm, make sure that the choke control is set to operation position.
- 13. Set the handle in mow position, see *To set the handle position on page 10*.



**WARNING:** Do not twist the starter rope around your hand.

## To stop the product

- Tilt the product and release the engine brake handle.
- When the engine stops, lower the product.
- Set the handle in park position, see To set the handle position on page 10.
- · Close the fuel valve.

#### To get a good result

- Always use a sharp blade. A blunt blade gives an irregular result and the cut surface of the grass becomes yellow. A sharp blade also uses less energy than a blunt blade.
- Do not cut more than 1/3 of the length of the grass.
   Cut first with the cutting height set high. Examine the result and lower the cutting height to an applicable level. If the grass is very long, drive slowly and cut 2 times if necessary.
- Cut in different directions each time to prevent stripes in the lawn.

# Maintenance

## Introduction



**WARNING:** Before you do maintenance, you must read and understand the safety chapter.

For all servicing and repair work on the product, special training is necessary. We guarantee the availability of professional repairs and servicing. If your dealer is not a

service agent, speak to them for information about the nearest service agent.

# Before you do maintenance work



**WARNING:** To prevent injury and damage to the product, obey these instructions when it is necessary to put the product on its side.

1. Close the fuel valve. (Fig. 29)

- 2. Let the engine run until it stops.
- 3. Disconnect the spark plug cable.(Fig. 30)
- Tilt the product to its left side, with the air filter (A) up and the muffler down.(Fig. 31)

Maintenance schedule

The maintenance intervals are calculated from daily use of the product. The intervals change if the product is not used daily.

# To do a general inspection

 Make sure that the nuts and screws on the product are tightened.

# To clean the product



**WARNING:** Obey the instructions in *Before* you do maintenance work on page 10 before you clean below the product.



**CAUTION:** Do not use detergent, gasoline or solvents to clean the product. That can cause damage to plastic parts.

- Do not use a high pressure washer to clean the product.
- If you use water to clean the product, do not flush water directly on the engine.
- · Use a brush to remove leaves, grass and dirt.
- Make sure that the cold air intakes are not blocked.
- Remove the fan (see To replace the blade and fan on page 12) and clean it with a brush.
- · Clean the surface of the product with a dry cloth.

 Clean below the product with a scraper to remove the buildup of grass and waste.

# To examine the cutting equipment



**WARNING:** To prevent accidental start remove the ignition cable from the spark plug.



**WARNING:** Use protective gloves when you do maintenance on the cutting equipment. The blade is very sharp and cuts can easily occur.

- Examine the cutting equipment for damage or cracks. Always replace a damaged cutting equipment.
- 2. Look at the blade to see if it is damaged or blunt.

**Note:** It is necessary to balance the blade after it is sharpened. Let a service center sharpen, replace and balance the blade. If you hit an obstacle that causes the product to stop, replace the damaged blade. Let the service center estimate if the blade can be sharpened or must be replaced.

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## To replace the blade and fan



**WARNING:** Use heavy duty gloves. The blade is very sharp and cuts can easily occur.

- 1. Prepare the product for maintenance work, see Before you do maintenance work on page 10.
- 2. Hold the fan tightly and turn the blade bolt (A) counterclockwise to remove it.(Fig. 32)
- Remove the blade (B), cutting height spacers (C) and the fan (D).
- 4. Examine the blade bolt and the fan for damages.
- Put the fan back in its initial position. If you add cutting height spacers, make sure that the pins are put in the holes on the fan.
- 6. Attach the new blade. Make sure that the pins on the fan (E) are put in the holes (F) on the blade.
- When you attach the new blade, point the angled ends of the blade in the direction of the ground.
- 8. Put the blade bolt through the center hole of the blade (G) and tighten clockwise by hand.
- Hold the fan tightly and tighten the blade bolt with a wrench.
- Pull the blade around by hand and make sure that it turns freely.
- 11. Start the product to do a test of the blade. If the blade is not correctly attached, there is vibration in the product or the cutting result is unsatisfactory.

# To set the cutting height

Add cutting height spacers to decrease the cutting height. Remove the cutting height spacers to increase the cutting height.

Note: Do not use more than 2 cutting height spacers.

- 1. Prepare the product for maintenance work, see Before you do maintenance work on page 10.
- 2. Remove the blade bolt and the blade, see *To replace the blade and fan on page 12*.
- Put 1 or 2 cutting height spacers (A) between the fan and the blade. Put the holes on the first cutting height spacer on the pins on the fan (B). Put the pins on the second cutting height spacer in the holes on the first cutting height spacer. (Fig. 33)
- Put the blade on the cutting height spacer. Make sure that the pins on the cutting heigt spacer are put in the holes (C) on the blade.
- 5. Attach the blade and the blade bolt, see *To replace the blade and fan on page 12*.

# To fill and change the engine oil

 For information how to fill and change the engine oil, refer to the operator's manual for the engine.

#### To clean the air filter



**CAUTION:** Do not operate the engine without an air filter attached or with a dirty air filter. This decreases the efficiency and can cause damage to the engine.

- Press the latch tabs (A), remove the air filter cover
  (B) and remove the air filter (C).(Fig. 34)
- Hit the air filter against a flat surface to make the particles fall off. You can also blow compressed air through the air filter from the clean side of the air filter.



**CAUTION:** Do not use a brush to remove dirt as this pushes the dirt into the air filter.

3. Clean the air filter holder (D) and the air filter cover with a moist cloth.



**CAUTION:** Do not let dirt enter the air duct that leads to the carburetor (E).

- Put the air filter back in its initial position. Make sure that the air filter fully seals against the air filter holder.
- 5. Put the air filter cover back with the bottom tabs first.

#### To examine the spark plug



**CAUTION:** Always use the recommended spark plug type. Incorrect spark plug type can cause damage to the product.

- Examine the spark plug if the engine is low on power, is not easy to start or does not operate correctly at idle speed.
- To decrease the risk of unwanted material on the spark plug electrodes, obey these instructions:
  - a) Make sure that the idle speed is correctly adjusted.
  - b) Make sure that the fuel mixture is correct.
  - c) Make sure that the air filter is clean.
- If the spark plug is dirty, clean it and make sure that the electrode gap is correct, see *Technical data on* page 13.(Fig. 35)
- · Replace the spark plug if it is necessary.

# To examine the fuel system

- Examine the fuel tank cap and the seal for the fuel tank cap to make sure that there are no damages.
- Examine the fuel hose to make sure that there are no leaks. If the fuel hose is damaged, let a service agent replace it.

# Transportation, storage and disposal

#### Transportation and storage

- For storage and transportation of the product and fuel, make sure that there are no leaks or fumes.
   Sparks or open flames, for example from electrical devices or boilers, can start a fire.
- Always use approved containers for storage and transportation of fuel.
- Empty the fuel tank before you put the product in storage for a long period of time. Discard the fuel at an applicable disposal location
- Safely attach the product during transportation to prevent damage and accidents.
- Keep the product in a locked area to prevent access for children or persons that are not approved.
- · Keep the product in a dry and frost free area.

#### To prepare for storage

Prepare the product for storage at the end of the season, and before more than 30 days of storage.

- 1. Stop the engine and close the fuel valve.
- Start the engine and tilt the product approximately 10 cm from the gound, in the direction of the muffler.
- When the engine stops, release the engine brake handle.

- 4. Disconnect the spark plug cable.
- 5. Drain the fuel from the fuel tank.
- Remove the spark plug and pour 5 ml of engine oil through the spark pluge hole.
- 7. Pull the starter rope handle 3 times to distribute the oil in the engine.
- Examine the spark plug, see To examine the spark plug on page 12. Do not connect the spark plug cable.
- Clean the air filter, see To clean the air filter on page 12.
- 10. Examine the cutting equipment, see *To examine the cutting equipment on page 11*.
- 11. Clean the product, see *To clean the product on page* 11.

# Disposal

- Obey the local recycling requirements and applicable regulations.
- Discard all chemicals, such as engine oil or fuel, at a service center or at an applicable disposal location.
- When the product is no longer in use, send it to a Flymo dealer or discard it at a recycling location.
