Using the Lawn Aerator

Wear your protective equipment including ear defenders and good strong

If your machine is fitted with a core collecting rake or tray make sure it is fitted

Do not operate the aerator on concrete or other hard surfaces - injury or damage

Do not run the engine when moving over paving or hard ground, or when positioning

Replace any damaged or broken tines to prevent overloading the machine or

Do not tilt the aerator to expose the tines if they are still rotating - the tines can

While working, keep a lookout for any stones or other objects in your path. Stop

11. Stop the engine before making any adjustments or replacing tines, or before

12. If debris or rubbish becomes tangled in the tines, stop the engine before clearing

13. Make sure that the machine does not become clogged with dust and debris. Stop
